## **ART CLASSES • Age 7-14 • AM and PM, Weeks 2-5, 7-11**

Students choose **two** classes per half-day session. Course descriptions are below.

### **Acrylic Painting**

**Blake Bean:** In this class, students will create a painting each day while learning the basics and sheer joy of acrylic painting.

### **Animal Art**

**Barbara Richert:** We will explore animal structure with different media, including pencil, charcoal, pastel, markers....and explore different styles such as Chibi and zen doodling. And let's draw your pet as a final project!

### **Crochet**

**Stephanie Carcano:** The class will include basic terminology and stitches, holding a hook and yarn, and reading a simple pattern. Students will make fun items to use or wear according to each individual's interests and skill levels.

### **Beads & Knots (ages 10-14)**

**Melanie Moses:** Students will create jewelry using techniques of macramé, weaving, and wrapping. They will learn to make bracelets, key rings, necklaces, and more. Beads of all different kinds will be incorporated into their work.

### **Dolls (ages 10-14)**

**Lisa Lalumandier:** Barbie can't compare with a Super Doll you make yourself! In this class, students will sew a cloth Super Hero and fashion it some clothes.

### **Clay**

**Melanie Moses, John Allen, Bailey Crow:** This class covers basic and intermediate instruction in clay. Returning students will work at their own pace on individual projects. Students will learn pottery techniques as well as additive and subtractive sculptural processes.

### **Drawing**

**Haley Campbell:** In this intro to drawing class, students will learn the basic elements and principles of drawing. They will also explore different methods and materials during this course.

### **Constructivism**

**Stephanie Carcano:** Students in this class will learn to embellish clothing and make your own pillows and bags using needle and thread

and basic hand sewing stitches. Students will learn basic embroidery and knotting techniques and sew beads and buttons on paper, fabric and plastic canvas.

### **Fabric Painting (ages 10-14)**

**Gladys Swanson:** Students will learn how to draw, paint, print, and use resist on different types of fabric. We will create artwork on a medium that's unlike any other!

### **Fiber Fun**

**Stephanie Carcano:** In this class, students will learn where wool comes from and what we can do with it. Explore how fluffy bits of softness can be transformed into something durable and practical. Make felt, spin yarn, weave and create other fun projects from the world of fibers.

### **Fun with Tempera**

**Melanie Moses:** Discover many ways to paint with Tempera. This class will learn to mix colors and use tempera with other media to create one of a kind paintings. Create a Tempera Batik and learn how to use tempera like watercolors.

### **Jewelry (ages 10-14)**

**Gladys Swanson:** In this class, students will learn how to make several types of jewelry using various materials. Projects may include necklaces, earrings, and bracelets made of beads, wire, and metal.

### **Knitting (ages 10-14)**

**Stephanie Carcano:** Create a shaped and textured fabric using two needles and yarn. Students will learn basic knitting techniques that allow them to make various items, as well as develop a new avenue for self-expression.

### **Manga "Whimsical Drawing"**

**Barbara Richert:** This class will cover the basics of Japanese style cartooning. Students will practice large expressive eyes, spiky hair, strong facial expressions, foreshortening, and action lines. Drawings in manga style are typically produced in black and white with different patterns to compensate for the lack of color.

### **Paper Crafts**

**Lisa Lalumandier:** In Paper Crafts, students

will explore many different ways you can create beautiful things with paper. This is not a class in Origami, however we will take a day to try our hand at the ancient art of paper folding!

### **Photography (ages 10-14)**

**John Allen, Bailey Crow:** This photography class will help students experience the world in a different light learning from the basics of working a digital camera to posing subjects their best way possible. This class will help students advance their photography skills to the next level.

### **Quilting**

**Lisa Lalumandier:** Step back in time and learn to piece a quilt by hand! Students will start from scratch...cutting out our pieces and completing a small one block quilt to hang on the wall!

### **Sculpture**

**Stanley Bohon, John Allen:** This class will emphasize 3-D design and experimental aspects of sculpture. Projects will include assemblage of found and repurposed objects. Students will be encouraged to think "outside the traditional box."

### **Toys**

**Lisa Lalumandier:** We will explore homemade toys in this class using everyday materials such as bottles, string, and balloons. No batteries needed!

### **Watercolor**

**Sarah Harbuck:** We will begin this class by learning about color theory and blending with watercolors. Students will also cover wet and dry painting technique on watercolor paper for various effects. We will end the week with painting a landscape or still life image.

### **Weaving**

**Stephanie Carcano:** An open frame, some fiber, and the innovation to pass threads over and under each other makes weaving both practical and artistic. You will build your own rigid heddle, triangle and stick looms, and learn how to warp them with fiber to prepare to weave and create the foundations for bracelets, rugs, wall hangings, and more. Ages 10 and up.
