



Art Camp offers a variety of classes to inspire kids of all ages. With small group sizes, your child will enjoy personalized instruction and a supportive environment to explore their artistic talents. From painting and sculpture to drawing and mixed media, each session delves into unique themes and techniques to spark imagination and develop creative skills. Who can take classes?

Art Camp classes are designed for children entering specific grade levels in the 2025-26 school year, including Kindergarten, 1st-2nd grades, 3rd-5th grades, and 6th-8th grades. Additionally, we offer Wee Art classes for children ages 2-4 who are entering Pre-K. These classes are shorter, last only one hour, occur less frequently, and require an accompanying adult.

What does it cost?

Classes hold a maximum of 10 students, and all supplies are included, including a snack halfway through each class. Costs are as follows:

K-8 class sessions: \$75

Wee Art sessions: \$35

Lunch Stay Fee: \$75

Late Pickup Fee: \$5 per minute following a 15 minute grace period

Wee Art

Wee Art classes provide a creative and engaging introduction to art for children ages 2–4 alongside their caregivers. Designed to foster a safe, fun, and hands-on learning environment for those entering Pre-K, these sessions focus on process-based art experiences that encourage exploration and creativity.

Older siblings are welcome to participate but must be registered separately. Younger siblings in strollers may attend unregistered.

Wee Art classes are held from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM or from 11:00 AM to 12:00 PM on Weeks 2 and 5 with Brittney Oliver.
